1. Key highlights


Highlight 1: COVID-19 Cases, Deaths and Laboratory Testing

- Cumulative total of 550,183 RT PCR and 281,943 RDTs laboratory tests were performed
- A total of 2,605 new laboratory tests (RT PCR) performed during the week
- More new confirmed cases (174) by PCR with a positivity rate of 6.7% were reported during the week, compared to those reported in the previous week (160 new cases), showing 8.8% increase
- Out of **24,714** suspects from health facilities in the week, **358 (1.4%)** tested positive for COVID 19 using Rapid Antigen Test
- Cumulative total of **35,003** confirmed cases by RT PCR with a **6.4%** positivity rate and cumulative total of **2,110** cases by Rapid Antigen Test with a **0.7%** positivity rate.
- The current circulating variant in Tanzania is Omicron from the gene sequencing conducted.
- Cumulative total of 804 deaths (CFR 2.3%) reported since March, 2020
- No new death was reported during the week
- No new cases or deaths were reported among healthcare workers during the week.
- Cumulative total of **3,351** confirmed cases among healthcare workers
- **Three (3)** new admitted patients were reported during the week

Highlight 2: COVID-19 Vaccination Status

- A total of **1,452,551** new people vaccinated during the week
- Cumulative total of 13,509,187 people fully vaccinated


Highlight 3: Geographical Distribution of COVID-19 Cases from 23rd to 29th July 2022 Tanzania Mainland

Weekly trend of COVID-19 RT-PCR Confirmed Cases from 03 Dec to 29 July, 2022




 From the beginning of year 2022, the number of newly confirmed cases continued to decline up to end of May 2022. An increase in the number of newly confirmed cases has been observed starting from early June 2022. In the current week, there is an increase by 8.8% in the number of newly confirmed cases by PCR reported compared to the previous week.

Key interventions

Surveillance

- Reviewed and analysed COVID-19-line lists, e-IDSR data received from regions
- Prepared and submitted SITREP NO. 45 to stakeholders including WHO.
- Conducted meeting to finalize the electronic EBS to enhance timely detection of alerts including those related to COVID-19.

Points of Entry

- Screening of travellers at Points of Entry was done. A total of 160,811 travellers were screened of whom 44,740 (27.8%) were international travellers, 103,426 (64.3%) domestic travellers and 12,645 (7.9%) were crew. Out of the screened travellers 1,969 (1.2%) were screened for COVID 19 using rapid antigen tests.
- Verification of COVID- 19 RT-PCR certificates was performed to overcome the challenge of counterfeit certificates. A total of 2,256 certificates were verified and one certificate was found to be a counterfeit.

Logistics.

- Updated users and facility information about the Covid portal system and its application
- To receive and analysed reports on the availability of Covid-19 health commodities from registered health facilities on COVID PORTAL
- Conducted follow-up on the number of registered health facilities that did not report on the COVID PORTAL electronic system. On the week ending Friday 29thJuly, 2022, a total of 117 (52.2%%) out of 224 HFs submitted the reports on time.
- Continued with follow up on clearing process of donated health commodities from France and Egypt government.

Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE)

- Continued with community-based initiatives countrywide through community outreach programs which are being implemented engaging vaccinators, Community Health Workers, and other community influencers to promote and enable community uptake of COVID-19 vaccines.
- Continued implementation of a strategy to utilize different events, reaching out to places of work and Institutions for COVID-19 health education and COVID-19 vaccines services provision.
- Disseminated COVID-19 messages through social media, national Radios, and TV as well as community radios countrywide.

Case Managements and IPC pillar

- Disseminated COVID-19 messages through social media, national Radios, and TV as well as community radios countrywide.
- Conducted preparation of Triage assessment and onsite mentorship in five regions (Dar-Es-).

- Participated to modifications of ICU drawings which was conducted at Arusha region from. The workshop involved ICU specialists, MOH experts and Architectures from MOH, Abbott and PORALG.
- Conducted IPC training to 45 HCWs in Ruvuma Region from 26th to 29th July 2022
